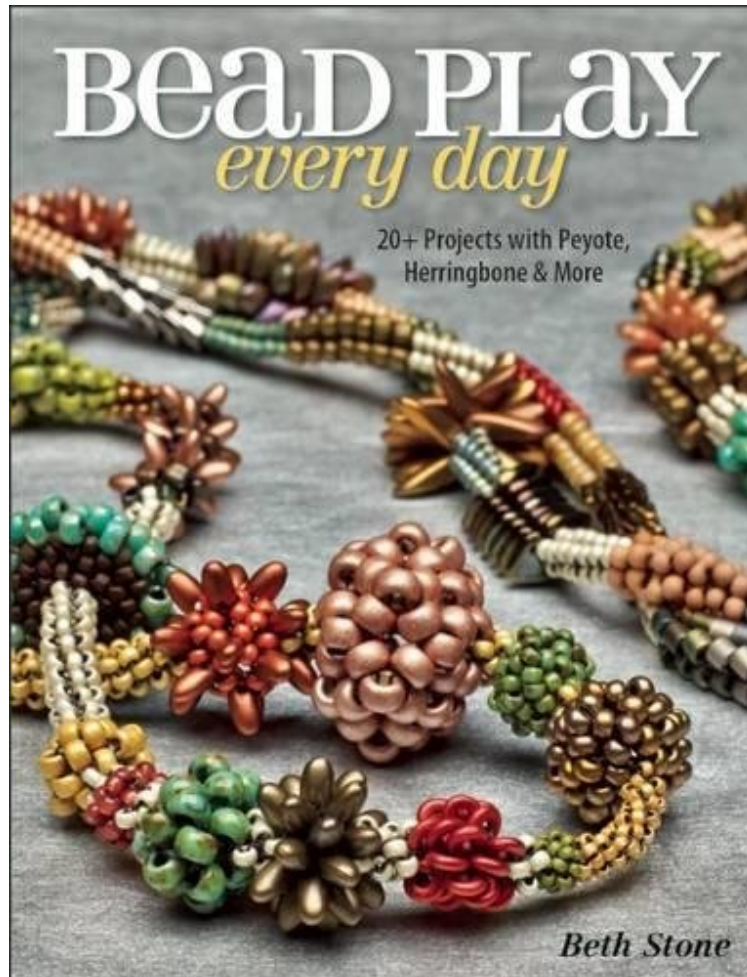

You have to use your imagination on what a finished project might look like. The description and how-tos are very short.
