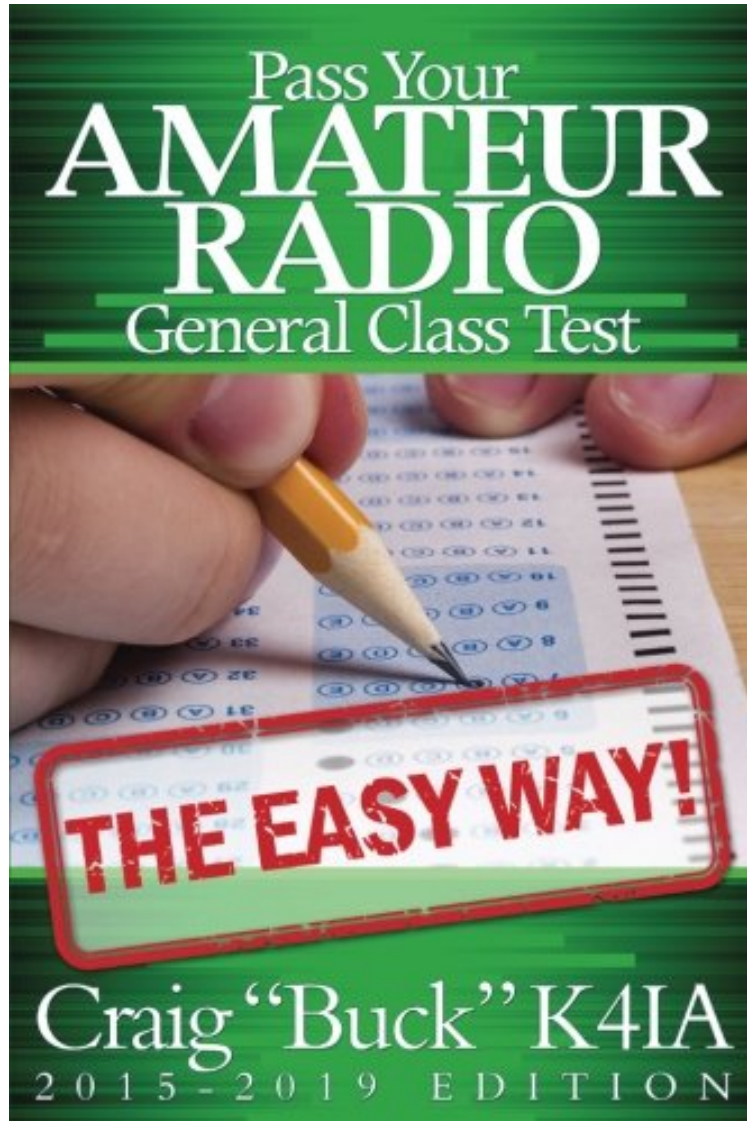

Although Electronics theory was not necessary to do this drafting function it was convenient to be surrounded by brilliant Electronic Engineers and Technicians. I left this position in 1982 and pursued a career in Business Management. Then in 1993 I told my wife I was going to attempt to try to get my Technicians ticket on a whim. (I long since lost any credentials of my earlier endeavor. Low and behold I passed, but again put it on the shelf not to use my new ticket to talk on VHF. This time I renewed my ticket as required so I am still current. About three weeks ago a neighbor also a Ham walked by and said you should upgrade, you do not need the code and you can talk to the world.. This got me thinking so I got on .Com and searched for books. I found Buck's Book and ordered it. One week from the day I received it I took and passed my General exam test (they told me I missed 4 answers) I can tell you get the book, read it cover to cover two times (lite reading) take an online test once then go for it. I suggest the ARRL book and Dave Casler's excellent videos on YouTube for depth of understanding the material and to make the study more interesting. Use this book to review all the test question related topics and prepare you to nail the test. Just as the author suggests, I never studied the test questions in the ARRL book - so never saw the 3 out of 4 distractor answers through most of my study preparation. By the time I started taking online tests to confirm my readiness for the test, the correct answers were popping from the screen. Even questions that should have taken some simple math to calculate the correct answer - I did not need to turn on the calculator. Correct answer I just knew. 7 of 7 people found the following review helpful. Study much better By Jerry E Irvin one of the best ways to study for your General Exam. The author uses a different way studying for the exam. He gives you only the right answers. You associate the question with the right answer and don't worry about multiple choice. I found it a much easier way to study

Here's a new approach to passing the General Class test. The test is multiple choice and the other study guides take you through the 462 possible questions including all four answers for each question. But three out of the four answers are WRONG! You are reading 1,386 wrong answers and that is both confusing and frustrating. The Easy Way focuses only on the right answers. All Ham and no Spam.
